Statistical Report January – December 2011

Statistical data for the period between January and December 2011 showed overall improvement in the Canadian trade balance.

Canada imports from the world, for the period of January to December amounted to over \$445 billion, which is a 10.41% increase from same period in 2010, while exports increased by 12.14% reaching \$447.76 billion.

As of December 2011, Canada reported a trade surplus in the amount of \$2\$ billion, after two years -2009, 2010 - of deficit. In the same period of 2010, Canada trade deficit with Italy had been slightly over \$3\$ billion.

In 2011, the increase in imports from Italy was slightly below the growth of Canada's total imports. Interestingly Canadian exports to Italy also rose by only 2.76% as oppose to the more robust growth, (+12.14%) in total Canadian exports. It appears that Italy was not amongst the key recipients of the resources and commodities which had driven Canadian exports.





In 2011, Italy still held the 10^{th} position in terms of value of exports to Canada having exported \$5.1 billion, which represents – as previously pointed out - an increase of 9.43% from the \$4.66 billion exported to Canada in the previous year.

Yet Italy's market share remained relatively low or slightly above 1% of total Canadian imports. The US, followed by China and Mexico still makeup the main suppliers of goods and services to Canada. These three countries jointly account for approximately 67% of the total Canadian imports from the world.





The most important category amongst the Italian exports to Canada, continues to be machinery. In 2011, almost ¼ of Italy's total export to Canada or \$1.24 billion were represented by industrial machinery and equipment.

Machinery and electrical machinery combined, (HS codes 84 and 85 respectively) accounted for over 28% of Italy's total export to Canada in 2011 (\$1.43 billion).

Having experienced notable growth (21.74%) over the previous year, the machinery sector was the main determinant of the overall increase of the total Italian exports to Canada.

In fact, Canadian Machinery imports from Italy increased at almost twice the rate as the total Canadian import of machinery from all countries, which grew by only 11.57%.

The contrast is even starker when the imports of electrical machinery and equipment are considered. Taking these imports into consideration, the growth of imports from Italy outpaced the overall sector's growth 3 to 1.

Considering only the product categories relevant to the Machines Italia sectors, (as listed in the table above and the chart below), total Canadian imports – from the world - increased overall by 13.43% with only very few sectors experiencing any decrease.

In 2011: graphic machinery, woodworking machinery and textile machinery imports from Italy increased sharply by 34.98%, over the previous year while foundry and metallurgy machinery and ceramic machinery from Italy increased by +200%. Only the sectors for fluid and power transmission and marble / stone machinery experienced sharp declines in 2011.

The metalworking machinery, followed by the food processing machinery, the packaging and plastic machinery continue to be Italy's top exporters - in terms of value - amongst the 15 Machines Italia reference sectors. Looking at market shares, Italian machinery for the ceramic industry, footwear, leather goods and tanning and the glass industry topped the rankings for Canadian machinery imports for the 15 Machines Italia sectors.
